MOBILITY LIAISONS

The Moving Maine Network (the Network) is seeking up to three (3) individuals with lived experience of transportation barriers to participate in the Network as Mobility Liaisons. The Network is a multi-sector, statewide initiative, focused on improving access to transportation for all with a focus on people experiencing barriers. Our work focuses on advancing cross-sector collaboration, informing policy change, and spurring innovative transportation solutions. As a Mobility Liaison, you will play a critical role in creating and advancing transportation solutions so that everyone is able to get where they need to go without facing barriers.

Mobility Liaison Role

Mobility Liaisons will share their expertise, experience, and ideas with the Moving Maine Network. At a minimum, Mobility Liaisons are asked to:

- Participate on the Moving Maine Steering Committee – The Steering Committee includes up to 30 individuals from all the sectors that influence transportation access, as well as people with lived experience of transportation barriers. The Steering Committee meets bimonthly to advise the work of the Network. [Click here to see a list of current members.](#)
- Serve on a Moving Maine Work Group – The Network facilitates three action-oriented work groups that meet bimonthly and as needed. Mobility Liaisons will select a work group based on their interest and contribute at least two hours per month to supporting activities. Work groups are:
 - Peer Learning and Professional Development - Creates and offers channels for ongoing communication, skill-building, and peer exchange.
 - Policy and Advocacy - Identifies and champions policy solution.
 - Technology and Innovation - Spurs statewide mobility innovations.
- Attend a Bimonthly Mobility Liaison Check-In – These will be convened by members of the Moving Maine Backbone Team to provide relevant training and support (30 minutes each – via Zoom or phone).

Preferred Skills and Qualifications

To be considered as a Mobility Liaison, individuals must have:

- Personal experience with mobility and transportation challenges (this might be because of disability, age, income, language, or other reasons)
- The ability to describe challenges faced by themselves and their peers
- A solutions-oriented and problem-solving mindset

Stipend

Mobility Liaisons will be eligible for a monthly stipend of \$50 through September 2021. Payment of the stipend will depend on ongoing participation.
